ARCHITECTURE WEEK 2007 – THE REGION CELEBRATES

Museums, galleries and theatres, cities, towns, villages and parks, architects, students and schoolchildren are all gearing up for Architecture Week 2007: the annual national celebration of architecture. From 15th – 24th June, Architecture Week will be celebrated across the country, with over 800 diverse cultural events ranging from film screenings to family workshops, all serving to encourage consideration of the built environment. This year's theme is *How Green is our Space?* focusing on sustainability and the environment, to encourage all of us to take a look at our surroundings and how they can be improved for the future.

Buildings contribute around 50% of the UK's carbon emissions, with houses making up 25% of that, so we have good reason to draw attention to our buildings and consider their spatial, social and environmental impact.

Events across the Eastern region will enable everyone to learn more about the buildings of their villages, town and cities, in a fun and informative way. A diverse range of events, from previews and tours of significant buildings to debates and exhibitions will take place, all of which can be viewed on www.architectureweek.org.uk by clicking on 'Region Guides' and then 'East'. A printed Regional Events Guide is available from Tourist Information Centres and libraries across the East of England, whilst the AW07 website will remain a constantly updated source of information on all events.

There will also be the chance for people to talk to an architect about design changes they could make to their homes with the RIBA Architect in the House scheme. RIBA chartered architects will again give hour-long consultations in return for a minimum donation to Shelter, the housing and homelessness charity, of £40. From 1st May members of the public can register for the scheme at www.architecture.com or

www.architectureweek.org.uk. They will be matched with a local architect during and after Architecture Week. Architects can register to take part at www.riba.org/archweek.

Venues and cultural organisations across the region including numerous architects' practices, Tourist Information Centres and award-winning buildings have scheduled innovative and exciting events.

Supporters of national Architecture Week include Founding Patron Janet Street-Porter, Secretary of State David Miliband, Culture Minister David Lammy, Tom Bloxham, Tom Dixon and Wayne Hemingway.

There will also be radio debates around the country to tie in with the new flagship BBC programme, *How We Built Britain* with David Dimbleby. Cambridge will be hosting the East's debate, which takes place at Buckingham House on 21st June from 18.00-21.00. Free tickets for the debate can be requested from riba.east@inst.riba.org or by telephoning 01223 566285.

Architecture Week is organised by a partnership of Arts Council England, the Royal Institute of British Architects (RIBA) and the Architecture Centre Network.

Louise Todd, Regional Director of the Royal Institute of British Architects (RIBA) East, commented: "Wherever you live in the region and whatever aspect of architecture, the arts or the built environment you're most interested in, we hope these events, exhibitions, talks and tours will give you the chance to celebrate the beautiful, ingenious, innovative, contemporary and historic buildings in our region."
